CSP Course

All first year students MUST register for a CSP course for the Spring.

Colloquia - CSP 50 - Students who choose one of the two colloquia options should enroll in both the chosen colloquium (CSP 50 or 51) and one of the associated seminars (50S or 51S). In addition to receiving credit for the spring CSP Requirement, completing either of the colloquia options this year, will also receive Group 6: Intercultural credit in the Cultural Studies Requirement.

Seminars - CSP 51 through 76 - Students not choosing the colloquia option above, must register for one of the CSP 4 courses in the spring. If you are interested in CSP 51, 58, 59, 61, 63, 71 or 72, you should register for either one of the 2 sections.
